OVERVIEW

Camelot Community Care’s Independent Living Services (ILS) supports young adults ages 18–21 participating in Florida’s Extended Foster Care program. These young adults are working toward education, employment, and independence — but they cannot do it alone.

WHY IT MATTERS

Young adults aging out of foster care often lack:

- Stable adult relationships
- Employment connections
- Safe and supervised housing options
- Practical life skills support

You can help change that.

PARTNERSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

BECOME A MENTOR

Provide consistent monthly support and encouragement as a trusted adult; with minimum commitment:

- Monthly check-ins
- One-year commitment
- Orientation + background screening required

BECOME AN EMPLOYMENT PARTNER

- Provide job opportunities
- Offer career coaching
- Assist with interview preparation
- Share workplace mentorship

SUPPORTIVE HOUSING / HOST HOME PARTNER

Provide a supervised living environment approved through Extended Foster Care.

Note: All housing partnerships begin with mentorship and relationship-building. Housing placements require orientation, screening, proposal approval, and compliance review.
